

## CUMULATIVE PASS RATES OF CALIFORNIA-ACCREDITED LAW SCHOOLS

August 1, 2009 – July 31, 2014

In accordance with Chapter 4. Rule 4.160 (M) of the *Accredited Law School Rules*, California-accredited law schools (CALS) must "...maintain a minimum, cumulative bar examination pass rate as determined and used by the Committee in the evaluation of the qualitative soundness of a law school's program of legal education." As specified in Guidelines 12.1 of the *Guidelines for Accredited Law School Rules*, the "minimum, cumulative bar examination pass rate" (MPR) required for CALS is 40%. CALS are required to calculate their rates annually for the preceding five-year reporting period.

CALS calculate their respective MPRs by dividing the total number of graduates who graduate during the reporting period and then take and pass the California Bar Examination (CBX) by the number of graduates who take the CBX, at least once, whether or not they pass over the same reporting period. Graduates of a CALS who never take the CBX are not counted in a school's MPR.
