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The State Bar of California submits this Second Supplemental Submission to amend the Supplemental Submission Concerning Methodology for Options for a Special Regulatory Assessment to Fund the State Bar to request authorization to allow for fee scaling and fee waivers. (Bus. & Prof. Code § 6141.1; Rules of the State Bar, rules 2.15 and 2.16.) As noted in Appendix F, footnote 20, of its original Request of the State Bar of California for Special Regulatory Assessment, an adjustment is necessary to account for the combined net negative revenue impact of fee scaling and waiver allowances. Based on an analysis of historical data related to the revenue impact caused by scaling and waiver requests granted in 2015 and 2016 as outlined in the table below, the State Bar estimates that an upward adjustment of 1.9% to the assessment options is needed.
