**QUESTIONS & RESPONSES**

**Question 1:**

Is it the intention for all devices to have the capability of Main Frame printing( AS 400). This requires additional hardware and software on each device at additional cost that may not be necessary.

Answer: IPDS/TCP based printing option can be addressed as an option based on cost; it is not the intent to require such of all devices.

**Question 2:**

Page 11 item 5. Please describe your definition of "hardwiring of units".

Answer: Hardwiring would be applicable to any special power conduits and/or other necessary cabling necessary to configure/install the equipment.

**Question 3:**

Page 11 of 45 item 8. Please supply total buy-out amount of existing equipment so we may offer an alternate proposal.

Answer: Item 8 refers to copiers/printers that are leased or purchased during the term of contract that will be awarded pursuant to this RFP. No current equipment is offered for buy-out.

**Question 4:**

Is the State Bar of California looking to replace all San Francisco and Los Angeles devices at the same time, or to upgrade devices as the leases expire?

Answer: Please see Exhibits B and C for a list of equipment to be replaced at the same time. Any other equipment (approximately three devices) will be replaced at lease expiration.

**Question 5:**

Exhibit B and C. Please identify which devices are owned outright, which devices remain on lease and balance of time remaining.

Except as noted, all devices identified in Exhibits B and C are at or near term. Please see Exhibit D for a list of equipment owned outright.

**Question 6:**
