In addition, to help you better understand the work of the Board of Governors, we have enclosed the *State Bar of California Board of Governors – Duties of Board Members*.

Only the official petition form, as prepared by the Secretary of the State Bar, will be accepted. The official petition and related documents can be downloaded from the State Bar's website, www.calbar.ca.gov (Home > About Us > Board of Governors > Elections). Requests for the petition form and related documents to be sent via U.S. Mail are also accepted via e-mail at michelle.pierce@calbar.ca.gov.

Completed petitions and related materials may be filed with the San Francisco office of the State Bar as follows:

Whether delivering originals or submitting via e-mail, completed petitions and related materials must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, April 1. Candidates who file via e-mail must keep the original nominating petition for four years following commencement of the term of office for which the petition is filed. Upon request by the State Bar, candidates must promptly forward the original nominating petition to the San Francisco office of the State Bar.

Information about each candidate from his or her State Bar membership record will be included with the ballots that will be mailed to voters. A candidate may add to this information by submitting an optional 250-word maximum candidate statement that describes his or her views and qualifications for office. Due to space limitations in the ballot materials to voting members, this statement is limited to 250 words. However, candidates may submit a separate expanded statement of up to 500 words for posting on the State Bar's election and internet voting web pages.

Please submit your candidate statement(s) in Word either by e-mail (if filing via e-mail) or on digital storage device along with a hard copy (if filing via delivery of original documents). Your completed nominating petition, optional candidate statement(s), and optional head and shoulders photograph for use on the web page (in jpg or tif format via e-mail or on digital storage device) must be filed with the State Bar no later than 5:00 p.m. on Friday, April 1.

As detailed in the Election Schedule, please note that, once nominated, a candidate may not withdraw acceptance of nomination after 5:00 p.m. on Monday, April 11.

Candidates wishing to conduct a mail campaign may purchase a State Bar district membership list for the district in which you plan to run. To obtain the list, a candidate must submit a fully executed "*Agreement for Use of State Bar Membership, Eligibility and Voting Lists*" and "*Hold Harmless Agreement*", along with full payment of the production fee. Please refer to the enclosed fee schedule, which also contains the dates when the various lists will be available for purchase.
