RE: Workplan for Delivery of the June 2020 First-Year Law Students' Examination and the September 2020 California Bar Examination

Dear Chief Justice Cantil-Sakauye and Associate Justices:

Pursuant to the Supreme Court's direction by letter dated April 27, 2020, attached is a workplan setting forth key goals, milestones, and beta-testing for the online administration of the June 2020 First-Year Law Students' Examination and the September 2020 California Bar Examination. The document is effectively three separate workplans: one for the First Year Examination, one for administering the Bar Exam online, and one for administering the Bar Exam in person should online administration not be possible.

We have been working diligently in the two weeks since the Supreme Court announced its decision to ensure that we identify the many challenges that must be addressed in a successful effort to transition the First Year Exam and the Bar Exam into online examinations. A sampling of the types of issues being considered, and categorized amongst the milestones in the attached workplan, include:

- Exam security and integrity;
- Technology including testing and development to be able to administer an online examination as well as changes needed to our existing Admissions Information Management System;
- Rule or guideline changes;
- Communications with applicants and law schools;
- Testing Accommodations or access issues that necessitate in person venues even for an online administration;

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- In person venues if the exam cannot be conducted online; and
- Grading

In addition, key to the ability to deliver the Bar Exam online, is whether the National Conference of Bar Examiners (NCBE) will provide a variation on the Multistate Bar Examination (MBE) that can be used effectively to scale the written portion of the Bar Exam and determine passing scores. We are in communication with NCBE on this matter, and hope to resolve that question within one week. We appreciate your staff's participation with us in those discussions.


The California Bar Examination is a high-stakes examination. We must approach our responsibility to transition this exam to an online administration thoughtfully, methodically, deliberately, and accurately. And, we also must do so quickly to meet the needs of the applicants and the direction of the Supreme Court.

The workplan is, by necessity, a living document. As we gain more information about the type of MBE we could have access to in an online environment, as beta testing proceeds, and as we learn more, we will update the workplan to guide our efforts toward a successful implementation of the First Year Law Students' Examination and the California Bar Examination. We will keep the Court apprised of significant developments.


