EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This agenda item is before the RAD Committee and the Board to approve the proposed new Rules of Procedure for Fee Arbitrations by the Antelope Valley Bar Association in the form attached as Attachment A hereto.

The Antelope Valley Bar Association (AVBA) has submitted new rules of procedure for fee arbitrations conducted by its mandatory fee arbitration program. The AVBA's proposed new rules of procedure consist of materially new rules to replace its current rules of procedure last approved by the Board in August 1994. The proposed new rules essentially adopt the State Bar's Model Rules of Procedure approved by the Board of Governors.

At its May 27, 2009 meeting, the State Bar's Committee on Mandatory Fee Arbitration (MFA) reviewed the AVBA's proposed Rules of Procedure for Fee Arbitrations and agreed to recommend their approval to the Board Committee on Regulation, Admissions and Discipline (RAD) and the Board of Governors as being in compliance with the State Bar Guidelines and Minimum Standards for the Operation of Mandatory Fee Arbitration Programs ("Minimum Standards").

I. BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 6200, subdivision (d), local bar associations are authorized to sponsor mandatory fee arbitration programs. The programs' local rules of procedure must comply with Business and Professions Code sections 6200-6206 and the State Bar's Guidelines and Minimum Standards for the Operation of Mandatory Fee Arbitration Programs ("Minimum Standards.") Approval by the Board of Governors gives the local bar programs jurisdiction to arbitrate fee disputes submitted under the auspices of the Mandatory Fee Arbitration Program. (Minimum Standards, Para.1.)

The Board of Governors last approved the Antelope Valley Bar Association's (AVBA's) rules of procedure for fee arbitrations in August 1994. The Board of Governors adopted the Model Rules of Procedure for Fee Arbitrations at its November 2006 meeting. The Model Rules were further revised in July 2008. The Model Rules provide the local bar programs with a template incorporating best administration practices and procedures consistent with the statutes and current case law developments. The AVBA submitted proposed new rules of procedure for fee arbitrations based on the Model Rules to the State Bar's Mandatory Fee Arbitration Committee (MFA Committee) for consideration at its May 27, 2009 meeting.

II. DISCUSSION:

The proposed new rules essentially adopt the Model Rules of Procedure with some minor modifications-such as the filing fee- customized for the local bar. Because the proposed new rules of procedure are so materially different from the AVBA's current rules of procedure, it was determined that a redlined version comparing the current and proposed versions of the rules is of little assistance. A copy of the proposed new rules of procedure for the AVBA program is attached hereto as Attachment A.

At its May 27, 2009 meeting, the MFA Committee found that the proposed rules of procedure for fee arbitrations attached as Attachment A comply with the MFA statutes and are consistent with the Minimum Standards. As such, the MFA Committee agreed to recommend to the RAD Committee that the proposed Rules of Procedure for Fee Arbitrations of the AVBA be recommended to the Board of Governors for approval.
